I am a multi-media artist, photographer, web-designer and graphic artist. I have an AS degree in Commercial Art and a BS in Art Education. My current position at Art Glitter has afforded me many opportunities to design projects, teach, write instructions and publish articles. I also had the great pleasure of co-writing with Barbara Trombley on her first book, "Glitter Artistry: Cards, Bags and Tags", (Sterling Publishing, Inc.), in 2006.

My passion for art started very early on when I over heard my Mother's friend tell her it is okay that I'm left handed, I'll just have terrible handwriting. On that day I began practicing my writing skills, which naturally progressed into the pursuit of drawing and other art mediums. I enjoy studying patterns found on wallpaper, floor tile, etc., trying to figure out where the design begins and end. I also have an eye for lines and shadows. Instinctively these elements influence my artwork. Many of my designs begin as two-dimensional objects then transpire into three-dimensional, eventually growing beyond their frame.

Even though my art is very organic, incorporating found objects and ephemera, glitter seems to find a way into many of my designs. And the Fantasy Film I use in my Melted Film Art is a medium I've really learned to embrace. It has brought a dimension to my work I never dreamed of experiencing.

My familiarity with the arts has taught me to think creatively in all endeavors and turned me into a bit of a jack-of-all-trades.
